AAC LEECHBURG OPEN FOR SERVICES!

PWAC's new Adult Achievement Center in Leechburg opened on September 30!

We started the process of preparing this building back in January, but the vision for this program has existed for even longer.



Last year, we realized that southern Armstrong County was an underserved area that could benefit from the introduction of a program like our Adult Achievement Center. With our mission of serving adults with disabilities in mind, and desiring to reach the people in that region who were without services, we began the process of finding a building that could house such a program.

After finding our building, we began the process of preparing it to house our new AAC. Our Progressive Lawn and Landscaping crews cleaned up the front courtyard, and our facilities staff have worked tirelessly to make repairs, small updates, and changes to the space to prepare it to best serve our clients.

Now, we are proud to say that AAC Leechburg is open for business, and we are so excited to see what's ahead! This location currently serves three clients and employs two staff members, but we are actively accepting referrals for clients and are looking to hire more staff. 


The PWAC Small Group Employment program frequently celebrates employees who have each excelled in their work and displayed an admirable, consistent work ethic.

OTHER PWAC HAPPENINGS






PWAC was awarded a grant from the Armstrong County Community Foundation to purchase new furnaces.
